| Admission criteria: | Credits in courses: <br> Academic Language Skills: Reading, Writing and Speaking 3 <br> Academic Language Skills: Listening and Structures 3 |
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| Exam objectives: | Verification of students' C2-Level language proficiency with respect to the four <br> language skills, i.e. writing, listening, reading, and speaking, with special attention <br> to academic style in writing and speech |
| Exam structure: | Five parts: Part 1 is an essay administered within the last class of the course <br> Academic Language Skills: Reading, writing and speaking 3; Parts 2, 3, and 4 <br> constitute an integrated test; Part 5 is a group discussion on an academic topic <br> related with the graduate proseminar's field of study |
| (1) Writing | Writing: <br> Focus: justifying academic importance of a selected issue, correct application of <br> academic style devices; Testing technique: essay |
| (2) Listening Comprehension | Listening Comprehension: <br> Focus: matching and completing information from texts; Testing technique: <br> multiple choice, gap filling, matching test |
| (3) Reading Comprehension | Reading Comprehension: <br> Focus: matching and filling the information from texts; testing technique: <br> multiple choice, gap filling, matching test |
| (4) Use of English | English in Use: <br> Focus: vocabulary, grammar, spelling, punctuation, word formation, unity of the <br> text, language register; Testing technique: multiple choice, gap filling, matching <br> test, error identification |
| (5) Speaking | Speaking: <br> Focus: grammatical correctness, pronunciation, stylistic unity and lexical variety <br> in speech, interactive communication, academic discourse; Testing technique: <br> group discussion with limited participation of the examiner. |
| Reading list: | Each part of the exam has the weighted value of 20 percent of the total, which is <br> calculated by adding partial scores. Final grades are granted according to the <br> following evaluation criteria: <br> grade 2,o (fail): o - 59\% <br> grade 3, o (average): 6o - 68\% <br> grade 3,5 (plus average): 69 - 76\% <br> grade 4,0 (good): 77 - 84\% <br> grade 4,5 (plus good: 85 - 92\% <br> grade 5,0 (very good): 93 - 100\% |
